As part of the University's ongoing commitment to modern slavery prevention, a Modern Slavery Prevention Procedure is now available through the UniSQ Policy Library. The procedure outlines the University's processes for identifying, assessing, managing and reporting modern slavery risks within its operations and supply chains in accordance with the Modern Slavery Act 2018 (Cth).

To coincide with the release of the procedure, a Modern Slavery Prevention Survey has also been developed and aims to gauge levels of staff awareness, potential areas of modern slavery risk, and actions taken to prevent or control these risks within the University's operations and supply chains.

The information gathered through this survey is confidential and will be used to inform the University's modern slavery prevention activities, management of risks, and may be included in the University's annual modern slavery statement. The University will not publish any information that can identify you, such as your name or staff ID number, and any information that is published will be de-identified.

The survey will take approximately five minutes

to complete and will be open until 31 January 2025. I encourage you all to complete the survey and share your insights on this very important topic.
