# 1. Preamble

## Why has this questionnaire been developed?

This questionnaire has been developed to help the University assess suppliers' policies and practices, their alignment with the [Queensland Procurement Policy](#) and ethical, social and environmental objectives.

## How should this questionnaire be used?

This questionnaire will be provided to existing and prospective suppliers to gain an understanding of the supplier's operations. This includes their approaches to addressing modern slavery risks and identifying where suppliers meet Queensland Procurement Policy objectives. These questions may also be integrated into tender processes and evaluation criteria. Suppliers are only requested to respond to an initial request or where the circumstances have changed for the supplier.

## Who should use the questionnaire?

The questionnaire is designed to be used by University staff both when undertaking future procurements and contract management activities. This includes assessing modern slavery risks in existing contracts which are not procurement in nature.

## How will information from the questionnaire be used?

The responses to this questionnaire are confidential and will be handled in accordance with the University's [Privacy Policy](#). Aggregated deidentified summaries may be shared through the annual submission of the University's Modern Slavery Statement and reporting frameworks outlined in the Queensland Procurement Policy.

1. Contravened a civil remedy provision of Chapter 2 or Chapter 3 of the [Fair Work Act 2009](#) (Cth) or committed an offence against the Fair Work Act.
2. Contravened a civil remedy provision of Chapter 2, 3, 4, 5 or 7 of the [Industrial Relations Act 2016](#) (Qld), or committed an offence against the Industrial Relations Act, or failed to pay employment related levies, or other payments established under Queensland legislation.
3. Failed to make superannuation contributions on behalf of employees in accordance with law.
4. Purported to treat employees as independent contractors, where they are not.
5. Required persons who would otherwise be employees to provide an Australian Business Number so that they could be treated as independent contractors.
6. Engaged persons on unpaid work trials or as unpaid interns, where they should be treated as employees.
7. Entered into an arrangement for the provision of labour hire services with a person who is not licensed under the [Labour Hire Licensing Act 2017](#) (Qld), or a supplier who is an unlicensed provider under the Act.
8. Paid employees wages below those provided for in an applicable modern award.
